### How big is the UK creative industry?

- £109 billion
- In fact, the UK's creative industries are vital to our economy - they employ over two million people and grow faster than other industries. According to recent statistics from the Department for Digital, Culture, Media & Sport (DCMS) they contributed £109 billion to the economy in 2021.
